- I. <u>To Receive Apologies for Absence</u> There were no apologies.
- 2. <u>To Receive Declarations of Interests (if any) of Members in respect of the business to be</u> <u>transacted.</u>

Cllr Meryl Wilkins made a declaration relating to her personal interest in the following subject; Street Naming of the Ilanmoor homes development Parc Tondu, Merthyr Mawr Estate land. PenY Fai Common. Cllr Meryl Wilkins' full list of declarations of interests can be found on the Councils website.

Cllr James Radcliffe declared an interest in the Planning due to his association with Bridgend County Borough Council Planning Committee.

3. <u>To confirm and sign minutes of the Extraordinary Council Meeting held on 30th June 2021</u> **Resolved**:

The Minutes of the Meeting held on the 30th June 2021 were confirmed and signed. Proposed by Cllr Heidi Bennett, seconded by Cllr Altaf Hussain.

- 4. <u>To consider matters arising from the Extraordinary Council Meeting on 30th June 2021</u> There were no matters arising.
- <u>To confirm and sign minutes of the Council meeting held on 8th June 2021</u>
 Resolved: The Minutes of the Meeting held on the 9th June 2021 were confirmed and signed. Proposed by Cllr Heidi Bennett, seconded by Cllr Altaf Hussain.
- 6. <u>To consider matters arising from the Council meeting on 8th June 2021</u> There were no matters arising.
- 7. <u>To receive Reports from Community Associations</u>

Cllr Griffiths on behalf of Pen Y Fai Community Association informed the Council of the success of the public Zoom meeting regarding Bridgends Local Development Plan. The Community Association is arranging a litter pick that has been arranged for the 1st August.

8. <u>To receive questions or comments from Members of the Public</u>

There were no questions from members of the public.

9. <u>To review standing orders</u>

The Clerk noted that no progress has been made so far.

10. <u>To receive a report on the Pheasant Field</u>

The Clerk informed the Council that the Lease is now in his possession and awaiting the Chair to sign.

II.To consider ways to address the current issues with speeding traffic, in particular along BridgendRd, and Penyfai Rd, Aberkenfig

The Council discussed the recent incident that occured within Aberkenfig along Bridgend Road. **Resolved:**

The Council agreed to write to the local PCSOs requesting them to monitor the area.

- 12. <u>To discuss NHCC current assets</u>
 - a. <u>Tree survey at the Woodland in Aberkenfig.</u>

The Clerk informed the Council that he has concerns that trees in and around Aberkenfig Woodland have not been tendered to for a number of years. The Clerk requested if the Council would agree to a Tree Severy to take place to better inform the Council regarding what maintenance is necessary.

Resolved:

The Council agreed for the Clerk to tender a tree survey with costings provided to Councillors during the Summer Break for agreement.

13. <u>To agree on the All Saints Church electric wire removal</u>

The Clerk updated the Council that a wire that connects to the Council's Christmas lights at All Saints Church requires removal to allow safe removal of a tree nearby.

Resolved:

The Council agreed to remove the wire at All Saints Church, the Clerk will provide the costing for approval via email.

14. <u>To confirm a co-option process for Councillor vacancies</u>

The Council discussed its preferences for the Co-Option process.

Resolved:

The Council unanimously agreed that it would require an expression of interest to be Co-Opted onto the Council.

15. <u>Finance</u>

a. <u>Future grants process for decision</u> **Resolved:**

The Council agreed to consider any applications on a 6 monthly basis. Each application should include certain criteria which would include the amount requested and how it would benefit the Councils Wards

18. <u>To receive BCBC Members Reports</u>

a. <u>Cllr Altaf Hussain</u>

Cllr Hussain informed the Council that recent complaints have been received from residents that food has been left outside local shops which may attract vermin. He assured the Council that it is being looked into.

Cllr Hussain noted that new dog bags have now been installed around PenY Fai along specific dog roughts. Along with new dog bags, additional patrols have been arranged to tackle littering and dog fouling within the borough.

A local resident provided their comments to Cllr Hussain regarding the Local Development plan and its possible arrangement of a gypsy within the Pen Y Fai Ward. Cllr Hussain had no comment to make and suggested local residents complain using the correct LDP process using the email address providing their response.

b. <u>Cllr James Radcliffe</u>

Cllr Radcliffe has received a number of complaints that a number of licenced premises within Aberkenfig are breaking Covid restriction and causing a lot of anti-social behaviour since they were allowed to reopen.

Cllr Radcliffe suggested that if anyone has a complaint please contact BCBC's licencing department and make a complaint.

19. <u>To receive Reports from Councillors</u>

Cllr Bennett reported that she has had a walk around our ward with the BCBC Cabinet Member for communities. She brought up the following issues for their attention, Fence at Cavendish park has been removed and is now causing a health and safety issue that allows members of the public to enter a building site. A log retaining wall at Cavendish park is falling apart. Cllr Bennett suggested that Cavendish park be placed on the upgrade list due to funding currently available to BCBC.
